

ADMINISTRATOR'S MESSAGE

Come, Holy Spirit, Come!

This weekend the Church brings to a close the glorious season of Easter, which began with the Solemnity of the Resurrection of the Lord and concludes with the Solemnity of Pentecost, commemorating the Descent of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles. The preeminence of these Solemnities is signaled by a feature that is unique to them. Only Easter and Pentecost both include and require an additional chant, called a sequence. The sequence, which is placed in the Liturgy of the Word between the second reading and the Alleluia, is a beautiful poem set to music that helps us appreciate and contemplate the event in salvation history that we are celebrating.

The sequence for Pentecost is "Veni, Sancte Spiritus" or "Come, Holy Spirit, come!" It is an inspiring Thirteenth Century prayer to the Holy Spirit with rich imagery that expresses our need, both individually and as a Church, for the consolation and guidance of the Holy Spirit. The prayer is not only one of adoration, but also of supplication as we repeatedly ask the Holy Spirit to shine within us. It is the Holy Spirit who comforts us in our afflictions, enables worthy thoughts and actions, heals our wounds, and redirects our wayward steps. Finally, we make intercession for all of the faithful, that the Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit may descend upon us, and that having lived virtuously, the Lord may grant us eternal joys. Let us spend some time praying with the Sequence of Pentecost this week.

Come, Holy Spirit, come! And from your celestial home Shed a ray of light divine!
Come, Father of the poor! Come, source of all our store! Come, within our bosoms shine.

You, of comforters the best; You, the soul's most welcome guest; Sweet refreshment here below;
In our labor, rest most sweet; Grateful coolness in the heat; Solace in the midst of woe.
O most blessed Light divine, may that light within us shine and our inmost being fill!
Where you are not, we have naught, nothing good in deed or thought, Nothing free from taint and ill.

¡Ven, Espíritu Santo, Ven!

Este fin de semana, la Iglesia pone fin a la gloriosa temporada de Pascua, que comenzó con la solemnidad de la resurrección del Señor y concluye con la solemnidad de Pentecostés, que conmemora el descenso del Espíritu Santo sobre los apóstoles. La preeminencia de estas solemnidades está señalada por una característica que es única para ellos. Solo Pascua y Pentecostés incluyen y requieren un canto adicional, llamado secuencia. La secuencia, que se coloca en la Liturgia de la Palabra entre la segunda lectura y el Alleluia, es un hermoso poema con música que nos ayuda a apreciar y contemplar el evento en la historia de salvación que estamos celebrando.

La secuencia para Pentecostés es "Veni, Sancte Spiritus" o "¡Ven, Espíritu Santo, ven!" Es una oración inspiradora del siglo XIII al Espíritu Santo con imágenes ricas que expresa nuestra necesidad, tanto individualmente como como Iglesia, de consolar y guiar al Espíritu Santo. La oración no es solo de adoración, sino también de súplica, ya que repetidamente le pedimos al Espíritu Santo que brille dentro de nosotros. Es el Espíritu Santo quien nos consuela en nuestras aflicciones, permite pensamientos y acciones dignas, cura nuestras heridas y redirige nuestros pasos descarriados. Finalmente, hacemos una intercesión por todos los fieles, para que los Siete Dones del Espíritu Santo puedan descender sobre nosotros, y que, habiendo vivido virtuosamente, el Señor nos conceda alegrías eternas. Pasemos un tiempo orando con la Secuencia de Pentecostés esta semana.

Ven, Dios Espíritu Santo, y envíanos desde el cielo tu luz, para iluminarnos.

Ven ya, padre de los pobres, luz que penetra en las almas, dador de todos los dones.

Fuente de todo consuelo, amable huésped de alma, paz en las horas de duelo.

Eres pausa en el trabajo; brisa, en un clima de fuego; consuelo, en medio del llanto.

Ven, luz santificadora, y entra hasta el fondo del alma de todos los que te adoran.

Cha Sở Nhắn Gửi (Pastor's Message)

Vào cuối tuần này Giáo Hội kết thúc mùa Phục sinh vinh quang, là mùa bắt đầu từ lễ trọng Chúa Phục sinh và kết thúc với lễ trọng kính Chúa Thánh Thần Hiện xuống, tức là ngày lễ Chúa Thánh Thần hiện xuống trên các Tông Đồ. Hai ngày lễ này đặc biệt hơn các lễ khác vì cùng có chung một điều nổi bật. Chỉ trong phong vụ lễ Phục Sinh và lễ Hiện xuống mới có bài Ca Tiệp Liên, được đặt giữa phần Lời Chúa (Bài đọc 2) và câu Xướng Alleluia, là một bài thơ tuyệt vời soạn theo điệu nhạc làm cho chúng ta cảm nghiệm được ý nghĩa của biến cố này trong lịch sử cứu độ mà chúng ta mừng kính.

Bài ca Tiệp Liên ngày lễ Chúa Thánh Thần Hiện xuống, "Lạy Chúa Thánh Thần, xin hãy đến..."

là một lời nguyện cùng Chúa Thánh Thần từ Thế kỷ 13 đã gây nhiều cảm hứng với những lời lẽ diễn tả sống động những nhu cầu của chúng ta, cá nhân cũng như của cả Giáo Hội, mang lại những an ủi và hướng dẫn của Chúa Thánh Thần. Lời nguyện này không những là một lời ngợi khen ca tụng, mà còn là một lời cầu Chúa Thánh Thần xin soi sáng lòng chúng ta. Chính Chúa Thánh Thần là Đáng an ủi chúng ta trong cơn gian nan, giúp chúng ta sáng suốt trong mọi ý nghĩ và hành động, chữa lành mọi vết thương, và giúp chúng ta bước đi trong đường ngay. Và sau cùng chúng ta cầu xin cho mọi giáo hữu, để 7 Ông Chúa Thánh Thần xuống trên chúng ta, và nhờ sốt sắng đạo đức, Chúa sẽ ban cho chúng ta niềm vui viên mãn. Chúng ta hãy cầu xin Chúa Thánh Thần trong tuần này với bài ca Tiệp Liên.

REFLECTIONS ON THE READINGS

THE RICHNESS OF THE SPIRIT



Students, and most adults recalling their school days, are familiar with the phrase “compare and contrast” that shows up from time to time on tests. Today we hear two different accounts of the giving of the Holy Spirit to the church. Let’s contrast, then compare. Luke’s account from Acts is filled with arresting details: the mighty wind from heaven, the tongues of flame, the miracle of different languages. John’s account seems timid: fearful disciples, the wounded Christ, the expelling of breath from his risen body, not from the sky. Our literal, modern minds wonder which way it happened; our noisy culture probably makes us prefer the former. But if we compare the two, we find that the dazzling richness of the Spirit fills both accounts, for it is the very breath of the risen Christ, ascended to the sky in Luke, that appears to his disciples in John and sends his followers forth to carry on his mission of forgiving sin and proclaiming the mighty acts of God.

El relato de Lucas en Hechos está lleno de detalles impresionantes: el viento poderoso, llamas de fuego como lenguas, el milagro de las diferentes lenguas. El relato de Juan parece tímido: discípulos temerosos, el Cristo llagado, el soplo de aliento viene de su cuerpo resucitado y no del cielo. Mientras nuestras mentes modernas y literales se preguntan de qué manera sucedió; nuestra ruidosa cultura probablemente nos hará preferir el primer relato. Pero si comparamos los dos, la deslumbrante riqueza del Espíritu llena ambos relatos, ya que es el mismo aliento del Cristo resucitado, ascendido a los cielos en Lucas, el que se aparece a sus discípulos en Juan y envía a sus seguidores a llevar a cabo su misión de perdonar los pecados y proclamar los portentos de Dios.



TREASURES FROM TRADITION

The roots of today's "birthday of the Church" are in an ancient Jewish festival of springtime harvest, seven weeks after Passover. Now, seven weeks after Easter, our great fifty days of rejoicing come to an end. In the countries where the Church first came to life, this is a time of harvest, and the first fruits appear: apricots and lemons, cherries and strawberries. Even in our gardens, herbs are abundant and asparagus, that close relation of the Easter lily, comes fresh to our tables. The earth is laden with so much new life, and that has always been a sign to Christians of Easter's glory.

Pentecost means "fifty" and our fifty days of Easter joy are complete. This Sunday is a day to savor the glory of Easter once more: picnics and cookouts, walks by the water, time in the garden—are all ways of extending the feast. Notice the paschal candle today, still burning during Mass. Our Easter celebration now complete, the candle will soon be moved to a place near the baptismal font, and be lighted at baptisms and funerals as a silent witness to Christ's abiding presence.

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
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
